Draft Horse Classic

The 33rd Annual Draft Horse Classic will be held at the Nevada County Fairgrounds in Grass Valley, CA September 19-23rd, 2019.

The Draft Horse Classic is the premier draft horse show on the West Coast and offers six different performances featuring draft horses and exhibitors from across the US and Canada. RV sites at the fairgrounds range from full hook-ups to dry camping and Susan Lewis is volunteering to coordinate reservations for overnight sites and horse show tickets when they become available on May 1st. Tickets for all 6 shows are \$85.00/pp and full hook-up sites are \$60/day. Susan is recommending we arrive at the Fairgrounds on Wednesday the 18th for 5 nights. Early arrival gives us the opportunity to have a guided barn tour and get up close and personal with these fantastic horses.

This would be an easy stop for those headed south from the Pendleton Rally when you leave there on Sunday, 9/15. The Draft Horse Classic is NOT a Rally - but Susan is offering to collect the funds in order to process our request for full hook-up RV Sites and Show tickets. Deadline is April 20th.

This is a chance to watch majestic Draft Horses pull meticulously restored freight wagons, work farm equipment, complete intricate maneuvers and compete with elegance and determination.!

January 11, 2019

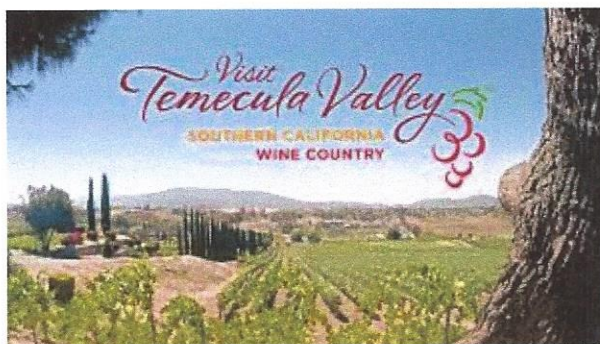
